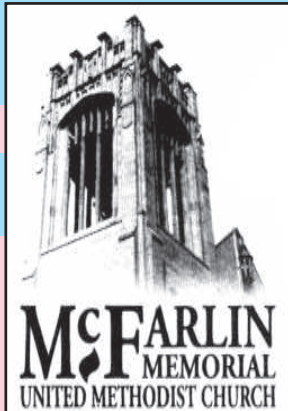

# Ministry Updates

## ***“The Relationship of Christianity to Other Religions: Obstacles and Opportunities in the 21st Century”***

The Jane and Herb Hengst Lecture is scheduled for Sunday, April 19, at 7 PM. It will be given by Dr. Charles Kimball, Director of the Religious Studies Program at the University of Oklahoma. Dr. Kimball's subject will be "The Relationship of Christianity to Other Religions." Established in 2006, the lecture-ship was funded through an initial endowment gift by Herb. The purpose is to bring speakers and teachers of recognized competence to McFarlin who are qualified to clarify the teachings of the historical Jesus, and apply them to contemporary interests and concerns.

A professor of comparative religion at Wake Forest before coming to OU, Dr. Kimball was also visiting professor at Tulsa University in the fall of 2006, and has also taught at Furman University where he served as director of international education. Considered an expert on issues related to the Middle East, he has been interviewed by more than 500 radio and television stations as well as major newspapers and broadcast outlets throughout the United States, Canada, Great Britain, Sweden, France, Australia, and South Africa.

Kimball has made more than 35 visits to the Middle East, and has worked closely with Congress, the White House, and the State Department over the last two decades. His articles have appeared in a number of publications, including *Sojourners*, *The Christian Century*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Christian Science Monitor*, and *the Boston Globe*. He is also the author of four books.

A native of Tulsa, Kimball has a bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State University, a master of divinity degree from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and a doctor of theology degree in comparative religion, with specialization in Islamic studies, from Harvard University. He and his wife, Nancy, have two adult children. Kimball grew up in Tulsa where he attended Will Rogers United Methodist Church.

I'm sure all of you know Easter Sunday is the largest attendance day of the year for our church. Many who attend will be those who either do not attend often or are first time guests to the church and we want to make sure we are particularly hospitable as befits a people gathered in Jesus' name. # Ministry Updates

## **God SMILES on Fewer MILES – let's save 1000 McFarlin Miles per Week!**

As a part of our Environmental Stewardship Initiative at McFarlin, the McFarlin Green Team has developed a mileage reduction program to coincide with Earth Week. Research shows that auto transportation accounts for approximately 39% of the energy use in the U.S., the biggest single source (compared to 3% from air travel, 1.5% for mass transportation, 19% for space heating, and 6% for air conditioning). Our goal is to save 1000 miles of driving per week within the McFarlin congregation, and to actually measure and document the savings within our church. Earth Day is April 22. The following Sunday, April 26, we'll begin the "God Smiles on Fewer Miles" program. During that Sunday service, and through this newsletter, we'll ask McFarlin families to establish a baseline for weekly mileage across all household cars, from Monday morning to Sunday evening. The baseline can be established by using a trip odometer, using odometer mileage, or by dividing the total miles on the car by the weeks the car has been owned. Starting Monday May 4 through Sunday May 10, we'll keep track of miles driven *while trying to reduce our mileage* to only necessary driving activity, and this will continue for several weeks. We'll be offering recommendations for reducing mileage over the next few weeks. If you'd like to participate in our "God Smiles on Fewer Miles" program, please begin establishing a baseline for miles driven per week starting as soon as this coming Monday, April 13. Truly, God Smiles on Fewer Miles!

## **Standing in the Gap**

## Hooray for Hollywood Chapel Choir Dinner Theatre April 21, 6:30 PM Fenn Hall

## What is that Tree with Blue Ribbons About?

Maybe you have asked that question about the tree on University across the street from the Sanctuary or some other tree in Norman. April is Child Abuse Awareness month. Trees with blue ribbons can be found around Norman and across the state as reminders of that emphasis and of the horrible reality of abuse. Last year, there were 11,000 confirmed cases of child abuse and neglect in Oklahoma. However, the actual number is much higher. In 2006, 34 of our children were murdered by abuse; many were under four years old. Photos of McFarlin's tree and scores of others will be displayed at the State Capitol on April 14 for Child Abuse Prevention Day. ## **Do You Want to Change Your Behaviors? Lead a More Balanced Life?**

CELEBRATE RECOVERY begins Tuesday, April 14 at 6:30 PM in Meyer Hall.

Celebrate Recovery is a biblical and balanced program that can help you overcome your hurts, habits, and hang-ups. Based on the actual words of Jesus that are sound psychological theory, this recovery program is the best program I have found for helping people change and those who have excessive behaviors of any type: food, co-dependency, alcohol, control, anger, depression, drugs, money, abusive or abused behaviors. It is based on one principle: Keeping your eyes focused on Christ and Christ's behaviors and model. Yes, you can overcome these destructive behaviors and grow toward full Christlike maturity.

We have been meeting for seven months, and have been through all 24 lessons. The class starts again at Lesson # 1 on Tuesday, April 14. This ongoing support group can be joined at any time as we all work and change at a different pace, yet this is an opportunity to "begin at the beginning." If your life is out of control, or you just want to change some behaviors that keep you from honoring God with all parts of your life, this is the class for you. For more information, contact Rev. ## **We Are the Church**

The "We Are the Church" commitment campaign has much to celebrate. The results thus far have been outstanding. We have over 300 Every Member in Ministry commitment cards to date. This demonstrates our membership dedication to the ministries of McFarlin. Pledges and contributions to the Debt Elimination have exceeded \$1,041,165. Even though our goal is \$1,300,000 over a three-year period, the amount pledged so far allows us to pay off our debt within four years and eliminates the \$900,000 balloon payment.

The commitments to the annual stewardship campaign are \$1,581,484. We have 485 pledges to date. We have reached 75% of our goal but still need over \$500,000 to obtain \$2,100,000. We thank each of you who have made a commitment. For those of you who have not pledged yet, we ask that you do so in order to help us obtain our goal. Every amount, whether large or small, is significant to the work of the church and is appreciated.
